DESCRIPTION

The work shall consist of furnishing and spreading requirements for the year 2018, of 38% Calcium Chloride Dust Palliatives on gravel roads in Clinton County for dust prevention.

MATERIAL SPECIFICATIONS 38% CALCIUM CHLORIDE

The material shall consist of a calcium chloride solution with no credit given to the magnesium chloride, alkali chloride, or any other substance in the solution.

For determining the percentages of calcium chloride in the solution will be determined by the methods based on the Methods of Sampling and Testing Calcium, A.S.T.M. Designation: D98 Year 2000 Compliance.

All material and workmanship is to meet or exceed the current Michigan Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Construction for Dust Palliative – 38% Concentration.

Any material failing to meet the certified percentage solution of Calcium Chloride shall be considered rejected material.

DELIVERY

The solution shall be delivered and spread on Clinton County gravel roads as directed by the Managing Director or his representative. The solution shall be applied using a positive displacement pump. Application will be a continuous treatment of at least one mile or a spot treatment of varying numbers of spots per mile. Each spot being approximately 300 feet in length.

ASSISTANCE

The Clinton County Road Commission assumes responsibility for preparing the road surface, by blading or by other means, in advance of the spreading operations to guarantee a reasonably smooth surface on which to apply the dust control solution.

The bidder will provide a list of equipment to be used on the project.

The bidder will provide three references of recent work completed including the company name, address, phone number, and contact person.

The bidder will be responsible for CDL compliance of any and all employees/sub-contractors used in fulfilling the dust control applications as specified in this document.

The Clinton County Road Commission shall be held harmless for any claims directly attributed to the dust control application.

The Clinton County Road Commission reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to accept the bid which is, in their opinion, in the best interest of the Road Commission.

The contractor's equipment shall have working lights and signs to alert the traveling public.

Contractors shall personally investigate road conditions prior to bidding. Failure on the part of the contractor to investigate and inspect will not be grounds for additional compensation.

Materials, equipment, components, or completed work not complying may be rejected by the Road Commission and shall be replaced by the contractor at no cost to the Road Commission.

MINIMUM INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Contractors working within the road right-of-way must have a valid certificate of Workers' Compensation Disability Insurance and Liability Insurance naming the Clinton County Road Commission commissioners and employees as "additional insured" and shall be on file at the road commission office before work begins. Minimum requirements are:

Auto Liability	\$1,000,000 Bodily Injury/Property Damage Owned & Non-owned including statutory Michigan No-Fault and Uninsured Motorists
General Liability	\$1,000,000 Bodily Injury - each person \$1,000,000 Bodily Injury – each accident \$1,000,000 Property Damage – each accident \$1,000,000 Single Limit Policy
Workers' Compensation	Statutory coverage

PAYMENT

Payment will be made 30 days from the invoice date pending road commission approval.

PRE-WORK MEETING

Prior to the start of work, the awarded bidder will attend a meeting with Clinton County Road Commission personnel for the purpose of discussing the work schedule and equipment to be used as well as the hours to be worked.

RENEWAL OPTIONS:

The Road Commission reserves the right to renew the contract for additional one-year terms. Each renewal to be mutually agreed upon by both parties. Pricing, terms and conditions of the original contract will remain the same for any subsequent one-year renewal period.

The bidder will be responsible to CDL compliance of any and all employees/sub-contractors used in fulfilling the bid specification.
